It's really important that if children have to leave early for any reason that they are signed out at the school office. This is to ensure that we know where children are!


Late for school


Book Fair

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Flu vaccines

Ballyboden Medical Practice has offered to come into school to administer the flu vaccine to all of the children (except for children in Senior Infants) free of charge.

This is administered via a nasal spray and involves no needles!

The vaccines will be administered on 11th October.

Senior Infants are not included as we understand the HSE is carrying out a separate programme for children in this class.

Illness and school

While the risk of serious illness from Covid-19 has abated, it hasn't gone away and we need to continue to ensure that children who are unwell do not come to school. Children who have been ill during the previous night should remain at home as they will be tired and unable to concentrate in school. They should not come to school if they need Calpol or Ibuprophen.
