Arriving late to school

All children need to be in school prior to 8.40 a.m. This is an important part of the school day when homework is checked, and the class prepares for the day ahead. It is embarrassing for children to arrive late when the school day has started as well as being disruptive to the class.



Children who are late need to be signed in at the office by parents.

Allergies and Medicine

Some children in our school have allergies, especially to nuts.
Therefore the school is a Nut Free School and we ask that parents are particularly careful not to give your child items that contain nuts in their lunch. This includes foods such as Nutella.

If your child has a medical condition or an allergy and needs to have medicine administered in school, you must fill in a Pupil Healthcare Plan and a Form of Indemnification. These can be found in our Administration of Medicine and Allergen Policy which is available on our website www.rpns.ie

If your child needs medication of any sort you need to make the teacher and school staff aware of this. All medication including epipens are to be given this to the teacher. Children should not have epipens or any medication in their schoolbags.

Illness and Covid-19

While the risk of serious illness from Covid-19 has abated somewhat, it hasn't gone away and we need to continue to ensure that children who are showing any symptoms of the disease should not come to school.

Children who have been ill during the previous night should remain at home as they will be tired and unable to concentrate in school. Children should not come to school if they need Calpol of Ibuprofen.

Extra curricular activities

Swimming






Swimming will resume this term on Thursday afternoons in Templeogue swimming pool for children in 2nd-6th classes. The lessons represent very good value for money and the coaching is of a good standard.

Traditionally swimming has been organised by parents and we are looking for 2-3 volunteers to take this on this year. All parents should also remember that if your child attends swimming you have to take your turn in supervising the children or arrange for someone else to do this. Therefore it is important that your vetting has been completed if you want your child to swim.

Homework Club?
