### **Substitute Supply Panel**

Once again RPNS was the base school for a Substitute Supply Panel. While we were sanctioned four teaching posts for the panel, we were only able to recruit one teacher, Julie Davis, due to the shortage of teachers.

Julie has been kept very busy this year covering absences in the 12 schools on our panel.

### **School Finances**

The Board of Management would like to thank parents for their continued support in the form of the voluntary contribution.

Without this important funding we would not be in a position to provide the children with many of the extras they enjoy.

While the DES does not encourage schools to seek voluntary contribution, the capitation grant per child is currently only approx. €200 per pupil per year. This is not enough to provide the level of facilities our children enjoy.

We are also extremely grateful to families who have made donations and completed the Revenue CHY3 form which applies to PAYE taxpayers. Under this scheme the school can claim tax refunds from Revenue which is an additional valuable source of income.

### Free Book Scheme

The free book scheme announced last year offered parents a significant saving on the cost of school books and allowed the school to provide a certain amount of stationery as well. However, the grant has dropped by €15 per child this year and does not cover everything that the children will need. There will be no charge for books but parents will need to provide some stationery and there will be a charge for photocopying, art materials and software licences.

Parents are reminded that the books remain the property of the school and children should treat their books with great care.

# **Assessment and Reporting**

Individual end of year school reports are issued to all parents in June. The reports are based on four areas of children's progress and achievement:

- Your child as a learner
- Your child's social and personal development
- Your child's learning across the curriculum
- Your key role in supporting your child's learning

Reports are written based on the child's work throughout the year and builds on the information given to parents at the parent-teacher meetings in November and as needed throughout the year.

The school carries out standardised tests and these are reported in the form of a Standard Score. Ranganna 3-6 also do class-based tests which help inform parents and teachers about each child's progress. Standardised test results are reported to the Department of Education and Skills in 2nd, 4th and 6th classes. In recent years the children took updated standardised tests which have been revised to reflect the updated norms in line with the improved literacy and numeracy standards across the whole country.

We are proud that our children perform above the national norms and our level of academic achievement remains high.

The 6th Class Report is in the form of an Education Passport which is passed onto the post primary schools to help the children's transition into secondary school.

### Whole School Evaluation (WSE)

In April the DES carried out an evaluation of the teaching of Maths in the school. Two DES inspectors spent two days visiting classes, meeting with staff and children and checking planning.

This co-incided with the introduction of the new Primary Maths Curriculum which will be implemented in full next year, with its more playful and hands-on approach.

The final report was excellent with the school being commended on the standard of teaching and learning. Teachers' practice was of a very high standard and the inspectors were very complimentary about the children's engagement, ability and behaviour. The were also impressed with the culture of collaboration within the teaching staff and the leadership team. The board was very please with the overall evaluation and congratulates the staff and children on a great result.

### **School Self Evaluation (SSE)**

Self evaluation remains at the core of the approach to teaching and learning in the school and this year the focus was on Science, while continuing in the areas of Assessment and Wellbeing.

### **Green Schools**

The school has a long involvement with the Green Schools Programme. This year the focus has been on Global Citizenship, litter and waste.

### Children's voice

In line with the new Primary Curriculum Framework, pupils are consulted on a wide range of issues. As well as the Green Schools Committee, there is also a Student Council which has two representatives from each class from 1st-6th Classes. The Student Council meets with Mrs. Perdue and Mr. Duff to bring forward issues and ideas from their classes. There is also a Wellbeing Committee which regularly introduces some ideas for good mental and physical health in Assembly.
