Cross Country



NCCA Draft Primary Curriculum Framework

On the 24th February the NCCA published a draft framework for the redeveloped primary school curriculum. This has been the culmination of consultation and deliberation with parents, teachers, schools, patron bodies and other stakeholders. Our school has been part of the Schools Forum which met regularly to examine research and tease out the issues facing primary education in the coming years, and to consider what the future primary school curriculum should be.

Parents and the wider public are encouraged to engage with the public consultation which will be open until October 2020 and to sign up for regular updates from the NCCA.
