SMARTPHONES

Last year a subcommittee of parents and teachers met to discuss and develop an updated policy on the use of smartphones. Following consultation with parents and much discussion it has been decided that the use smartphones and devices that use the internet are to be banned for use by pupils (this includes smart watches). Pupils may continue to have ordinary mobile phones, if their parents wish (no internet access). These should be turned off and given to the teacher during school hours.

Pupils who bring smartphones to school will have them confiscated. Parents will have to collect these phones from the school office.

School Choir

Lost Property

Every year we accumulate a small mountain of clothing that we can't reunite with their owners! Please can you ensure that your child's belongings are all named. The lost property is hanging up in the corridor at the main entrance. Please take a look there regularly and see if your child owns any of it.

Transport Grant

The Church of Ireland Board of Education operates a transport grant which is available to protestant pupils who live more than two miles from their nearest protestant school, or more than two miles from a scheduled service which is deemed to service the school. If you feel you might be eligible for this grant you should apply to the School Transport Section of the Department of Education and Skills on 057 9325465.

Traffic and Parking

Traffic in the laneway and parking are ongoing issues for the school and local residents often complain about parents' behaviour on Washington Lane. Please note that although we operate a voluntary one way system, the lane is two way and other road users and residents are entitled to drive along the laneway in both directions.

We also get complaints about parents parking in such a way as to block residents' access. Please note that Washington Grove is a private road and parents are requested not to park there. Drivers should not turn cars in the laneway as this is a hazard for small children. Also, please park before letting children out of the car and don't block the road for other users. Thank you for your co-operation.



Late for school!

Children who are late for school need to be signed in at the school office. Please try to get to school on time as it is disruptive for classes and discourteous to other pupils and teachers. Some children (and parents) are persistently late for school - you know who you are!
